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How much electricity does Guatemala have?

As of 2020, Guatemala had 4110 MW of installed electrical capacity, based primarily on hydro power (38.38%), fossil fuels (30.36%), and biomass (25.20%). Other renewable sources represented a much smaller percentage of capacity, including wind (2.61%), solar (2.25%) and geothermal energy (1.20%).

How is electricity regulated in Guatemala?

Guatemala's electricity industry is regulated by the General Electricity Act (Ley General de Electricidad) and the CNEE (Comision Nacional de Energia Electrica). The DGH (General Direction of Hydrocarbons) regulates the hydrocarbon sub-sector.

When did Guatemala's electricity market become free?

Guatemala's electricity market has been operating as a free market since 1996. This was when the activities of the electricity industry were separated, opening the generation and commercialization of energy to free competition.

What is the National Energy Plan of Guatemala?

The National Energy Plan of Guatemala defines the promotion of renewables as a priority. The plan aims to promote the use of clean and environmentally friendly energy for domestic consumption without losing sight of energy security and the need for supply

What is Guatemala's energy source?
