

How to communicate without a base station in Copenhagen

The public transport system in the Danish city of Copenhagen is quite extensive, with a bus, train and metro network. The metro system, which is unique in that it does not have a driver, runs along the eastern end of the city centre and connects Christianshavns Torv and Kongens Nytorv with Nørreport.
